## 9. Healthy Youth Survey - October 28

Our school (along with almost all schools in the State) is participating in the Washington State Healthy Youth Survey during fall 2021. The survey will be given to students in Grades 10 and 12

The Healthy Youth survey includes questions related to physical activity and diet, unintentional and intentional injury, substance use, sexual behaviors, abuse, risk and protective factors, and access to school-based services. Survey results are used by schools, communities and state agencies to plan programs to support our youth and reduce their risks.





Participation in the survey is voluntary and the students' answers are anonymous. There is literally no way to track any answer back to any student.

# 11. Advanced Placement (AP) News!

This year, NCHS is planning to return to the traditional test taking methods in person and on paper. This is subject to change, if needed.

Here are some highlights for getting started and/or confirming registration and payment in a timely manner. More information can be found below.

- Deadline to register on College Board and pay on Total Registration: NOV. 15th!
- Exams are currently being planned in person and on paper, as opposed to offering them virtually last year;
- \*Note: It will help a great deal if students register their LEGAL NAME and not their preferred name. This will help process their registration, payment, and scores efficiently

## ADVANCED PLACEMENT TESTING INFORMATION 2021-22 SCHOOL YEAR

Overview: The 2022 AP exams will cover the full content in each AP course, so students have the opportunity to receive college credit and/or placement. Every AP student should keep their options open by registering for the exam on time because there will be a \$40 fee for late orders. The College Board will support in-school testing in 2022 because administering exams in schools maximizes access and opportunity. If safety concerns still prohibit any students from testing at a school, the College Board will provide a contingency testing option that contains full course content.

Students: You must create a College Board Account. Students will need a College Board account to join their AP class section, receive AP assignments from teachers, get feedback on class progress, and register for AP exams (note: parents should not create an account for the student). If you don't have a student account go to <a href="https://myap.collegeboard.org/login">https://myap.collegeboard.org/login</a>. Already Have a College Board Account? All College Board programs are connected through one account. If an account was created for AP, PSAT/NMSQT or SAT, you just need your username and password to sign in. (\*Note: It will help a great deal if students register their LEGAL NAME and not their preferred name. This will help process their registration, payment, and scores efficiently)

# OCTOBER 1-NOV 14: Registration & Payment is a 2 STEP process (Must complete both parts for each AP exam to be registered)

<u>STEP 1 (Deadline is Nov 15, 2021):</u> Students will need to login or create a College Board account <a href="https://myap.collegeboard.org/login">https://myap.collegeboard.org/login</a>. Students will also need a "join code" in order to join a class section. Please ask your teacher for specific join codes for North Creek HS AP

classes, each class has a unique join code.

- STEP 2 (Deadline is Nov 15, 2021): Students will pay for their AP exam fees via Total Registration here: <a href="https://user.totalregistration.net/AP/480013">https://user.totalregistration.net/AP/480013</a>
- It is recommended that students use their Northshore email account (@apps.nsd.org) when registering for both Total Registration and the College Board. Failure to use the same NSD email on both sites may cause a student to not get the correct AP exam.
- \*Note: It will help a great deal if students register their **LEGAL NAME** and not their preferred name. This will help process their registration, payment, and scores efficiently
- AP exams will cost \$144 each and must be paid for by November 15<sup>th</sup>, 2021 to avoid having to pay a late exam order fee (\$40).
- Any students who qualify for Free & Reduced Lunch are eligible for a fee waiver and will not have to pay for an AP exam.

# Late Registration Fee Mandated by College Board

 Students may register for an AP exam after November 15<sup>th</sup>, 2021 (up until March 15<sup>th</sup>, 2022), but will have to pay an additional \$40 per exam late order fee

## 12. Halloween Costume Guidelines

Students wishing to wear costumes to school, football games, or other school-related events must keep these guidelines in mind:

- Regular school dress code applies (underclothing/lingerie is not appropriate as a costume please refer to district and school dress code policy).
- Costumes should not, in any way, disrupt the learning environment (ability to carry school supplies, being seated in class, blocking view of others, etc.).
- Costumes may not demean any race, ethnic group, disabling condition, religion, nationality, gender, gender identity or sexual orientation.
- Costumes cannot reflect graphic violence or gang affiliation.
- Face masks are still mandatory per Covid protocols, however, no full-face or pullover masks.
- No props or look-a-like weapons of any kind
   (i.e. anything you can hold in your hands is a prop, for example, swords, baseball bats, etc.).
- No silly string or slime.
- Shoes must be worn.
- Pacifiers, baby bottles, false teeth, anything placed in mouth, and glow sticks are not allowed. These items are considered paraphernalia associated with drug use.
- NO CLOWN COSTUMES We are asking for your cooperation in not allowing students to dress up as clowns at any school event due to the disruption and fear it may cause. If anyone shows up with a clown-related costume, they will be asked to change or be sent home.



Keep in mind that all school guidelines still apply. Students will be expected to comply with requests of staff members to make the appropriate changes in dress/costume. The success of this day, as always, will impact consideration of future dress up days.

If you have any questions as to whether the costume is appropriate or not, please ask an administrator before the costume is worn to school or a school event.

Thank you for your cooperation and assistance in helping to make wear costumes fun but not disruptive or inappropriate.
