End of term final grades are pulled in June and late January. These grades are posted on students' permanent transcripts. Students must be passing 6 of 7 classes or 6 of 6 classes. Students not meeting this WIAA requirement are placed on a 5-week probation in which the athlete can practice but can't compete/perform at games.

EVENTS:

- Uniform Fitting Day Tuesday, April 5th, 3:30-6:00. I agree to and will attend the uniform fitting. Once fitted, all cheer families are responsible and liable for the costs incurred, regardless. Part 3 – Parent Participation

Parent participation and support is essential to the success of each cheerleader on the team. Fundraisers: Parent and cheerleader promotion/participation is expected for fundraising events. The purpose of fundraising is to reduce the out-of-pocket costs of participation in NCHS cheer. Because fundraising benefits the cheer families, it is expected that the fundraising is driven by the cheerleaders and their families, not the coaches. Fundraising is required in order to offset the cost of camp and future cheer expenses and to remain in good financial standing with the school. Part 4 – Expectations and Agreement

Financial Expectations and Costs

It is a large financial commitment to be a North Creek High School cheerleader and the majority of that commitment comes at the very beginning of the season. Once camp and uniforms are paid for (payments start in May, 2022), there will not be any other "big ticket" purchases. Coaches Pumma and Nelke will do everything possible to minimize costs, prioritize fundraising, yet still select quality garments that will serve the team well throughout this season and beyond.

Above and beyond any physical products we choose, there are required costs associated with competition registration fees, professional choreography, and team building activities. Please see the below information for a detailed breakdown of costs.

Uniforms

Please pay careful attention to the Varsity Spirit Fashions North Creek High School Cheer Team 2022-2023 Quote for estimated uniform costs (once available, this will be found on the Cheerleading page on the NCHS website.). This must be paid in full to Varsity Spirit Fashions on the dates determined as of the uniform fitting on April 5th (uniforms will be paid in three installments). Additional uniform and other expenses are below.

Additional Expenses (payable to NCHS). The following items total approximately \$344:

- **ASB Card:** Approximately \$60 per student
- Game Day hair bows: \$50 due on Monday, April 20th.
- Rain jackets: We will order 3 rain jackets (purple, white, and pink) @ approximately \$26/jacket.
- Pom Poms: Approximately \$14
- Breast Cancer Awareness Tshirt: Approximately \$25
- Sweatshirt / Hoodie: Approximately \$35
- NCHS Team Duffle Bag: Approximately \$60 + tax and shipping due on TBD.

Additional Items that we intend to pay with our booster club fundraising efforts:

- **Leggings:** traditionally paid by the booster club.
- NCA Cheer Leadership Camp: approx. \$450 due byTBD. (This may be paid by parent boosters)

^{**}There may be some expenses that will not be run through NCHS ASB or ordered from Varsity Spirit Fashions. These items may include senior gifts, holiday party, secret pal gifts, bonding activities, etc.

Competition Uniforms

North Creek High School Competitive Cheer Team will use the same primary uniform pieces that were used for sideline cheer. The following uniform items will need to be purchased for the competitive season and are included in the cost listed above:

- Competition Indoor-Only Cheer Shoes approximately \$80 (these will also be used for basketball season and will be included in the original Varsity quote)
- Competition Cheer Bow approximately \$20

Competition Registration Fees

Registration fees will be covered primarily through required fundraising efforts. Below is an estimate of registration fees that will be associated with our involvement in 4-5 competitions.

Each competition costs \$250 to register the team.

Total estimated team competition registration costs: With a goal of attending 4-5 competitions, our estimated registration costs will be \$1,000 to \$1,250.

Professional Choreography

We have hired a professional choreographer through NCA. This choreography will be taught in three 3-hour sessions sometime between August and September, **date and time TBD**. Our estimated cost of choreography is approximately \$1,500. This expense will be covered through our fundraising efforts (both booster and ASB fundraising).

Commitment, Conduct, and Appearance Expectations

Academics: Cheerleaders academics should remain their top priority all cheer season. Throughout the year during every sport season, grades will be checked by the athletic department. Cheerleaders are required to maintain at least a 2.0 cumulative GPA (NSD policy) and passing 6 classes (WIAA policy) and must maintain this minimum all year. Our athletic director, Mr. Jefferson, will notify students of academic ineligibility if applicable and discuss the process and requirements to gain eligibility. During ineligibility, cheerleaders will not receive further consequences from cheer, as long as cheerleaders are communicating and actively following through on their plan to become eligible. Cheerleaders will be required to practice, however will not be able to participate or wear full uniform at any games/events during ineligibility.

Extra-Curricular Activities: I understand that my extra-curricular activities/personal obligations cannot conflict with NCHS Cheer. Knowing the cheer schedule, it will remain a top priority, after my family and academics. I realize I am on a team that is committed for an **entire** year and I will not be able to participate in NCHS Fall/Winter sports, although I can choose to participate in a Spring sport. The season begins at the selection of the 2022-2023 team, and ends when the winter sports season is complete. I understand that other activities need not conflict with the cheer schedule. I want to be a part of this year-long commitment to the NCHS Cheer Team.

Leadership/Respect: I understand that being a part of a team requires respect for my school, staff, administration, coaches, family, friends, and myself. I respect my coaches/administrators and trust that they have the best interests for the whole team in mind. I believe they will be as consistent as possible in planning and scheduling practices, events, games, as well as following through with consequences, and will communicate to the best of their ability. I am aware that NCHS cheerleaders take action to prevent and eliminate drama, and understand that gossip, dishonesty, meaningless conversations, and destructive comments undermine the team experience and destroy teams. I will commit to being a part of our program even when it's difficult.

<u>Appearance</u>: I understand that the coaches strive for their cheerleaders to have a positive appearance in and out of uniform. School attire must always show respect for their bodies and follow the North Creek High School dress code. Tattoos, (if any) are to be covered while in uniform. Cheerleaders are expected to have natural colored hair (ie. not blue, pink, etc.) that can be pulled back into a ponytail and/or away from the eyes. Per the Washington Interscholastic Activities Association (WIAA) & National Federation of High Schools (NFHS) rules, fingernails, including artificial nails, must be kept short, near the end of the fingers and be appropriate for practice, events, and games.

Equipment/Uniforms: I understand that my uniform and/or cheer equipment are my full financial responsibility, because I get to keep the items I purchase. I may not allow others to wear or use any of my NCHS cheer uniform/equipment. If I do not make the team again in the future, I understand that my uniform cannot become "spirit gear" for games (worn either by myself or others) until every cheerleader who owns that uniform graduates. Cheerleaders are required to wear the appropriate undergarments and assigned white socks. A black, white, or nude racerback style bra is required when wearing the sleeveless top. Cheerleaders will be assigned a certain bow to wear for each event. The only shoes permitted to wear while in cheer uniform are our cheer athletic shoes.

<u>Jewelry</u>: Per the NFHS and WIAA rulebook, cheerleaders may not have on any jewelry while in motion. Cheerleaders will be expected to remove all jewelry when at practice, performing, etc.

<u>Social Media</u>: I will use social media responsibly and ensure that all screen names, posts, re-posts, and pictures reflect positively on my personal character and reputation, my team, my teammates, my family, and my school. I will **T.H.I.N.K** before I post: Is it **TRUE**? Is it **HELPFUL**? Is it **INSPIRING?** Is it **NECESSARY**? Is it **KIND**?

<u>Injuries</u>: I will report all injuries to my coaches immediately. This includes injuries from both cheer and other outside activities. If an athlete visits a doctor for any medical reason, it is required by the WIAA that all athletes provide doctor medical clearance in writing in order to return to activities, whether practice or game.

<u>Carpools/Team Bus</u>: It is an NSD policy that participants of an event cannot drive themselves to any school sanctioned events outside of a 9 mile radius. When bus transportation is not provided, carpools will be established for travel of any distance over 9 miles. At such time, all cheerleaders are expected to go to and from the event in the assigned carpool. All drivers will be WSP cleared drivers and will have necessary forms for carpool procedure. Carpool procedure needs to be followed for the safety of all cheerleaders. Failure to comply will result in consequences. This is also the case when being transported to an event via team bus. Cheerleaders are required to load the bus together at NCHS, and return from the event on the team bus back to NCHS.

C.A.R.E Policies and Procedures & Card System: This system helps keep disciplinary actions consistent for everyone and allows for accountability for any behavior that the coaches feel is unacceptable. All consequences will be recorded and dated on a stamp card. Cheerleaders will have the opportunity to earn stamps back at the coaches' discretion. All cards will restart at the beginning of Spring/Summer (April–July), Pre-Season Summer/Fall (August–November when fall sports ends) and Winter/Competition (November when fall sports end–February) seasons. Below is a list of conduct unbecoming to a cheerleader and the consequence assessed for each violation. Please remember that this list is subject to change at the discretion of the coaches and written notice will be given should such changes occur.

Definitions:

<u>Sitting Practice</u>: If a cheerleader is too ill/injured to practice, s/he is still required to attend practice and observe. Exception: if cheerleader is contagious, vomiting, or has a fever.

Tardy: If a cheerleader is late to practice or event by 5-20 minutes

<u>Early Dismissal:</u> If a cheerleader leaves practice or event by 5-20 minutes early.

Excused Absence: (these examples are primarily in reference to practice dates/times, NOT performance dates/times...unless emergency related)

- Cheerleader has emailed BOTH coaches regarding the intended absence 2 WEEKS IN ADVANCE
- The absence is honorably school related, family related, pre-arranged family trips/plans, or emergency related
- Typically, unavoidable circumstances at the discretion of the coaches
- Physical therapy or doctor appointments related to an injury, should be attempted to be scheduled on a non-practice day or time, however if unavoidable will be excused at coaches' discretion
- Extended illnesses or injuries (3 or more cheer days) will not result in consequences in the C.A.R.E system, however all extended absences are required to have a doctor's note to return to activity.

Unexcused Absence:

- Cheerleader failed to notify BOTH coaches of absence in a timely manner (see above) REGARDLESS of the purpose of the absence
- Absence is school related (i.e., deciding not to come to practice to work on assignments you need to
 proactively manage your time for school work and cheer practices), work related, concert, or
 recreational event related, or anything avoidable in nature.

<u>CONSEQUENCE</u>: To be fair to everyone, consequences are applied whether sick, travel (planned or otherwise), outside school activity, volunteer hours, etc. Consequences are not to be considered disciplinary actions or punishment. All practices are critical for the success of the NCHS cheer team in using necessary progressions, strength/conditioning, and proper technique. Missing practice presents a possible safety risk to self and teammates. In the event the cheerleader is benched for a game or event (unless it is due to academic ineligibility), he/she is required to be dressed in full uniform, sit with the coach or team, and the cell phone is to be kept in his/her bag.
